Amazon Sidewalk shares your bandwidth with your neighbors. If you allow access to your devices, what is the maximum total monthly data per account that it may use?



Learn from The Network Guy

My neighbor told me that thanks to Amazon Sidewalk, a shared network, her outside camera now works much better. I've noticed that some of my outside devices are working better too. What is Sidewalk and why would I want to share my broadband Internet services?

The Network Guy:

Amazon Sidewalk creates a low-bandwidth network with the help of Sidewalk Bridge devices including select Echo and Ring devices. These Bridge devices share a small portion of your Internet bandwidth which is pooled together to provide these services to you and your neighbors. Essentially, you are likely both benefiting from sharing your bandwidth services.

There are always pros and cons to any situation, but if you are concerned about sharing your bandwidth, you should know that this setting is automatically set through Amazon to allow access. According to Amazon, the maximum bandwidth of a Sidewalk Bridge to the Sidewalk server is 80Kbps, which is about 1/40th of the bandwidth used to stream a typical high-definition video. Today, when you share your Bridge's connection with Sidewalk, total monthly data used by Sidewalk, per account, is capped at 500MB, which is equivalent to streaming about 10 minutes of high-definition video. Ring customers who own an eligible device can choose to update their Amazon Sidewalk preferences anytime from the Control Center in the Ring app or Ring website. Echo customers who own an eligible device can update their Amazon Sidewalk preferences anytime from Account Settings in the Alexa app. If you have linked your Ring and Amazon accounts, your Sidewalk preferences on either your Alexa or Ring app will apply to all your eligible Echo and Ring devices.

The Lehigh Valley IronPigs became the first minor league baseball team to have its entire 72-game home schedule televised live in 2008. For the tenth consecutive season, all IronPigs home games air on a four-station network created with Service Electric Cable TV, Inc. In addition to the games airing on SECTV (TV2), the telecasts are also carried live on Service Electric Cablevision, Blue Ridge Cable, and WYLN 35.

The network airs each home game to more than 900,000 households in Eastern PA and Western NI.

WFMZ Channel 69 televises all IronPigs home Saturday games in addition to other select games. The partnership will allow for the entire Lehigh Valley to receive Iron-Pigs telecasts, as WFMZ is carried on all local cable stations and satellite providers and can be picked up by antenna.

All games on the IronPigs TV Network powered by Service Electric feature a 35-minute pre-game show and a post-game show.
