

What's the Difference

Between Broadband Cable and Broadband Fiber...

...and why does the type of connection to a location matter?

Broadband cable is delivered via coax cable, which contains a copper core and is insulated with aluminum, a copper shield, and a layer of plastic. Since it utilizes electrical signals, it is inherently more susceptible to weather events. Also, as a shared connection, speeds can vary based on network traffic. Broadband is typically more than adequate for an average household and is more cost-effective, especially with bundle deals.

What is Broadband Fiber?

Ultimately, the biggest difference from our traditional broadband is the "last mile" (although it is often less than a mile). This is the stretch between the main fiber network and the end user. Terms like Fiber to the Home (FTTH) and Fiber to the Premises (FTTP) denote how close to the end users the fiber runs. While a broadband cable service may use fiber to the edge of a neighborhood and then use coaxial cable to the customer's location, broadband fiber uses a pure fiber connection all the way to the location, bringing increased symmetrical speeds. It's worth noting that this is still a shared connection, unlike a dedicated fiber connection that is a direct line to the premises.

Stay tuned! Some of our partner cable companies are offering broadband fiber in select areas, but it will become more widely available in the coming months.

Fun Facts

Neptune, like Uranus, is one of the two outer planets known as an "ice giant." Made up of more ices than Jupiter and Saturn, the chilly body almost seems to be in a class by itself. Different images emphasize the features on Neptune.

The cells contain a chemical called luciferin and make an enzyme called luciferase. To make light, the luciferin combines with oxygen to form an inactive molecule called oxyluciferin.
