Pike County Government

Pike County, Pennsylvania is a scenic area on the northern border of the state and is part of the Pocono tourism region. The county is named for Zebulon Montgomery Pike, the discoverer of Pike's Peak who was a General who perished in the War of 1812. The area is rich in history and full of natural beauty, including forestlands, streams, waterfalls, and mountains, making it a popular travel destination.

In 2004, the Pike County Board of Commissioners began meeting with PenTeleData to discuss the possibilities for connecting their offices in Milford with the Pike County Correctional Facility in Lords Valley, as well as other offices in Blooming Grove and Shohola. Unfortunately, at that time, the lack of fiber optic infrastructure made the costly initial goal almost unattainable. Instead, PenTeleData partner Blue Ridge Communications stepped up their initial plan to invest \$5 million building fiber optic infrastructure and committed to a \$25 million investment to strengthen the fiber network for both residential and commercial customers in the county. The next step was to find a solution specifically for the Pike County government, one that could meet their needs with an affordable price tag. At that time, the answer was Multiplex EtherPoint, a service from Pen-TeleData that allowed them to connect multiple locations through one physical connection. It drastically cut down on the price tag associated with the then popular T1-type solutions provided instant connection of data between their judicial and law enforcement community.

Fast forward to 2020 and Barry Bernathy, Pike County IT Department Director, shared how the county government currently uses PenTeleData services, "We primarily use PenTeleData for fiber and Internet services. There are many county and court offices located throughout the county and all are connected back to our main Administration Building in Milford via Fiber. Over the past couple months, with the pandemic, our infrastructure was crucial in allowing our employees to continue to provide essential services by working remotely. Employees took advantage of our virtual services and were able to work from home and still have access as they did while in the office. With our High Speed Fiber infrastructure, we had the bandwidth to supply hundreds of employees a day with our secure VPN services to bring up their desktops from work at home and continue to function like they were at the office. We are currently making upgrades to our fiber system to provide faster service to all offices not located at either the main Administration Building or the Lords Valley Complex. Once the upgrade is complete it will expand our use of SIP services, teleconferencing and other services along with providing additional Internet bandwidth to all county government offices, which is needed now more than ever because of all the new services that we had to use in working from home and keeping our county running to provide essential services to all residents."

When asked about reliability, he added, "Without question the services have been reliable. So much so that our Pike County 911 Center uses the fiber infrastructure to carry 911 phone calls between our backup 911 center at the Administration Building in Milford and the main 911 Center located in Lords Valley. By use of PenTeleData's reliable fiber infrastructure, we have also tied in Wayne County 911 and share phone services between the 911 centers to provide redundancy and reliability to both Pike and Wayne. In the very rare instances that we have an issue, we have always had the best service with a very fast resolution."

Don't Fall for Scams and Spam

Have you ever gone to a website and been greeted by a pop-up box that tells you that you've won some fantastic prize?

It will usually require you to enter your contact information, including a mailing address, and a credit card number. Maybe you have recently been offered some sort of special "COVID-19 offer" if you provide your banking information to claim the funds. We hear of these phishing attempts often, including one that says it's from PenTeleData and that we're offering a special price on the prizes of your choice. Guess what? It's a scam. The solicitation is not from us and the only surprise participants receive is unwanted charges to their credit card.

Nearly everyone who has an email address they regularly use has run into at least a small problem with spam. What is spam? Spam is bulk, unsolicited email—most often, it's trying to sell you something, and sometimes it's trying to convince you to relinquish your credit card information, bank account information, and any other personal information you're willing to give. This makes spam not just a regular nuisance, but dangerous as well. If you're one of the millions of people who receives spam messages in your inbox, you're probably wondering what can be done about it.

At PenTeleData, we are just as concerned about scams and spam as you are—in fact, we use spam filters to help reduce the amount of spam traveling over our network. Unfortunately, online predators often know how to get around the filters, so we can't catch it all. In addition, the scams can look very professional and "real". That's where you can help.

- Although malicious websites and email scams have been around for quite some time, some tactics that criminals use have become more believable than ever. It is VERY IMPORTANT to protect your computer and your personal information, such as usernames, passwords, social security numbers and account numbers.
- > PenTeleData will never ask our customers for personal information in an email or pop-up box. In fact, no matter who you are dealing with (your bank, utility providers etc.) you should NEVER EVER, for any reason, include personal or financial details like account numbers, login names, passwords, credit card numbers or social security numbers in an email or in response to a pop-up box. When we send an email, you can verify its authenticity by matching it up on our website at www.ptd.net/news, under the option of "Email Announcements".
- > The best way to avoid spam is to avoid getting on the spammers list in the first place. When you sign up for something on the Web, there is often some innocent-looking text at the end of the form that indicates your permission to be contacted by select third parties. Watch to be certain that selecting the box (or not selecting it) is the option to opt out. Otherwise, your email address is automatically shared.
- > You should change your password(s) at least every six months. Avoid using real words or personal information. Choose a longer password over a shorter password and don't use the same one for multiple sites. Use a variety of characters, numbers and symbols.
- If you are unsure whether an email request is legitimate, try to verify it by contacting the company directly. Do not use contact information provided on a website connected to the request; instead, check your previous statements for contact information.
- > If you like to receive advertisements and coupons or share your email address at your favorite stores, use an alternate address specifically for that purpose. In other words, use a second email address solely for these emails and avoid giving your primary address.
